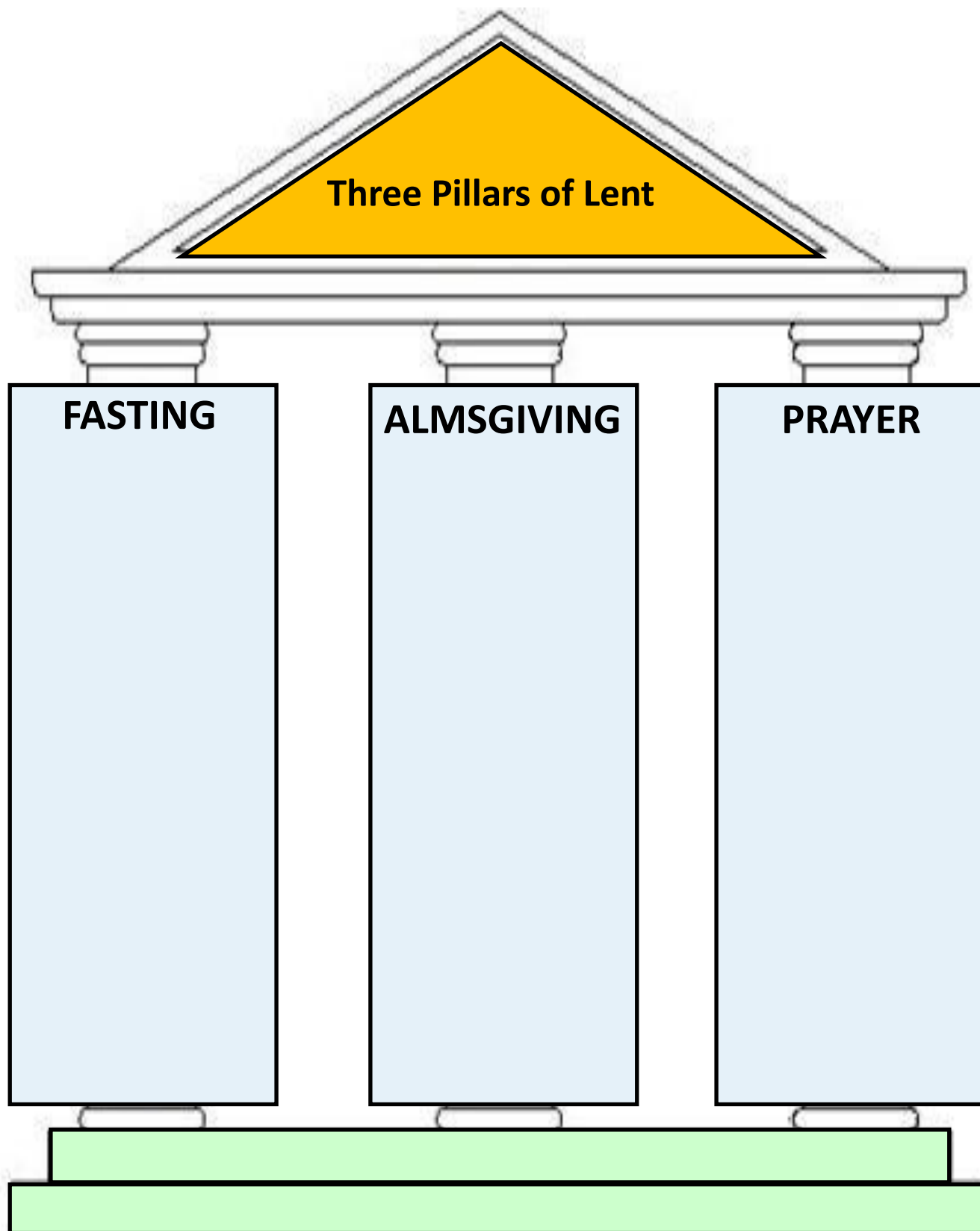

Did you know that Saint Katharine Drexel was a Missionary?

Our own Philadelphia Mission Saint

- Francis Drexel, Katharine's father, was a wealthy Philadelphia banker, gave generously to charity. Francis' wife, Emma Bouvier, opened their home three times a week to give food and clothes to the poor. Their daughter, Katharine was formed by this example.
- In her travels to America West, Katharine saw the squalor and poverty of the Native American reservations. After her father's death in 1885, she used her inheritance to fund schools for the native people.
- In 1887, Katharine went to visit Pope Leo XIII to



beg for Missionaries that could help reawaken the desire of her youth and the native people she wanted to help. The Pope looked to Katharine and suggested she, herself, become a Missionary, saying, *"Why don't you go to them yourself?"* Katharine took his words to heart.

- In 1894, Mother

Katharine took part in opening the first Mission boarding school called Saint Catherine's Indian School, in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

- In 1897, Katharine asked the Friars of St. John the Baptist Province of the Order of Friars Minor to help staff a Mission for the Navajos in Arizona and New Mexico, and she would help finance their work with the Pueblo Native Americans.
- By the time of her death, she had more than 500 Sisters teaching in **63 Schools** throughout the country and she established **50 Missions** for Native Americans in 16 different states.

Mission Focus: Northern Thailand



Books and Lunch for Tribal Children in Thailand

Located in Thailand's northern provinces on the mountain slopes bordering Myanmar, there are now 80,000 Akha and Lahu people living

These indigenous hill tribes have fled civil wars in Burma and Laos. The

Akha and Lahu people are among one of the smallest, poorest and least-developed hill tribes in Southeast Asia.

They live in remote villages in stilt houses made with natural materials. The nearest schools require uniforms and other school fees. These costs make it impossible for families to afford—most of the children cannot attend.

Although they live in simple conditions, Missionaries have brought the “Good News” of Jesus and also hope to provide children with an education.

The **Missionary Childhood Association** helps provide 200 Akha and Lahu children with an education and textbooks, school uniforms and transportation.

Please pray and sacrifice for the Akha and Lahu children and as a MCA member take a part of “*children helping children*” around the world.

During Lent, remember to not only pray for the children in Mission countries, but also the people who have been called by God to help them! They need our prayers to help them have the strength, faith and courage to continue doing hard work around the world.

Taylor and Katie Schmidt and their six children; Malachi, Ruth, Leo, Anthony, Faustina and Adele are a full-time Missionary family in Peru. They are building a church for the Morropón community because there isn't one. Mass is just held every two months inside a barn. This faith community desires a church of their own. The community has the land to build on and have raised \$300.00 themselves. The Schmidt family has raised \$20,000.00 and will help with construction themselves.
