
EXTRAORDINARY YEAR & MONTH OF MISSION

To awaken awareness of the missio ad gentes and reinvigorate the sense of responsibility for the proclaiming the Gospel with new enthusiasm, are the reminders for each and every Catholic. The reminders combine the pastoral concern of Pope Benedict XV in his Apostolic Letter Maximum Illud, published 100 years ago, with the Missionary vitality expressed by Pope Francis throughout his papacy and in his Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium: "Missionary action is the paradiam of every work of the Church." While we may not travel to another country to do so, we need to go beyond our daily concerns, and offer our prayers and gifts so that others may come to know and to believe in Jesus Christ by:
 - 1. PRAYER One Hail Mary or a Rosary Daily for Missionaries and the people they Serve.
 - 2. SUPPORT OF CATHOLIC MISSIONARIES
 - \$1 a day for a month gives much-need medical treatment to an adult or child for a month in Manila, Philippines-one of over 15,000 clinics in Mission lands
 - **\$10** provides a meal for 10 children per day one of the over 9,500 orphanages supported by the *Societies*
