Divine Mercy Sunday

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. On this day, Churches throughout the country are encouraged to join together in prayer and adoration seeking God's mercy for ourselves and for our nation.
